

When the Russians force civilians out, they make them strip completely naked They walk without even undergarments or shoes); <u>5.</u> anti-burn preparations; <u>6.</u> thermal underwear (winter is coming and there is heat insecurity with the gas issues); <u>7.</u> backpacks; <u>8.</u> water filters; <u>9.</u> power banks (portable solar ones) which are used to charge phones and as a flashlight); <u>10.</u> quality vitamins as they can't get them there and nutrition is at a very low point. The donations may be placed in the totes marked <u>Medical Supplies for Ukraine</u> in the Fellowship Hall. Also, there is an excellent article from <u>upmatters.com</u> from April regarding Joe and Tiffany Ampe story about what they are doing to assist Ukraine refugees. AUGUST'S MONTHLY MISSION

IN AUGUST, we will focus on Scholarships for Liberian (Africa) Children, which is educational in nature. We all take education for granted. We pay our taxes and all of our children receive a high school education with no additional charges to the parents. Parents in Liberia pay for their children's education. Any kind of financial crisis for the family leads to the kids dropping out of school.

Pastor Albert (former Pastor of Mitchell Methodist Church here in Negaunee) has personally identified three children who need help with education expenses:

• Danlette is the daughter of a Christian minister who has passed away and she is still in school. Her mom, Promise, is struggling to meet the educational needs of three children.



• Simeon has completed the lower grades but cannot continue because his father was laid off by his mining com-pany. Simeon has dropped out of school because the funds to pay the school authorities are not available.

• Obey is an extended family member of pastor Albert. His dad passed away five years ago leaving an uneducated mom with five children. He will need \$350 per year to help support his family and which is a huge sum of money for his family.

Any help with education expenses will be helpful. We have all heard the expression, "A mind is a terrible thing to waste".
