Sunday School Curriculum

The Winter Term runs from January 7 through March 17. Lessons will focus on Jesus' Ministry. Early in the term, we will learn about some of the miracles Jesus performed. In Biblical terms, a miracle is something so extraordinary that it could only

happen through the power of God.

We learn that although the miracle helped the individual(s), the greatest purpose of that miracle was to demonstrate God's power to the people who observe the miracle. When people observe this miracle, their <u>faith</u> increased. As we study these Bible stories, we look for:

- Where is Faith small?
- Where is **Faith** big?
- What happened to increase that faith?

COUNCIL CORNER

Highlights from November/December



- Affirmed the hiring of Julie Vargason as the new church secretary.
- Established the 136th Annual Meeting date of Sunday, February 4, 2024 at 11:00am. This meeting must be attended in person.
- Established a nominating committee for the purpose of finding delegates to fill:
 - * One Council position.
 - * Three Northern Great Lakes Synod Delegates
 - * Two Fortune Lake Delegates
 - * One Endowment Fund Delegate
- If you are interested in learning more about these opportunities to serve Immanuel as a member of the Church Council, or as a delegate to the Northern Great Lakes Synod, Fortune Lake, or as a member of the Endowment Fund, please talk to Pastor Bree, Noreen, or any current member of the Church Council.
- Learned that the Elevator Project is 80% complete. We have run into issues with completing the last 20%. There has been an add-on cost of \$7,500 due to the State of Michigan Elevator Code change.
- Voted to change the schedule of worship services by moving the Monday night service to Sunday night at 6:00pm.
- Approved the 2024 Proposed Budget, it will be presented for congregational approval at our Annual Meeting.

January & February Mission Emphases

<u>IN JANUARY</u>, our Tanzanian Connection and Relations will be the Mission Emphasis (ME). Many miles separate us, but we discover God's blessing of strengthened faith and vitality in the relationships we develop visiting and being visited by our Tanzanian brothers and sisters in Christ.

January's above-and-beyond ME offerings will go to our Immanuel Companion Congrega-tion fund, to help defray the cost of traveling to Yombo Lutheran Church of the Eastern and Coastal Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania this May.

Financial Peace University

My Immanuel Family,

I come to you with an

opportunity for the New Year. We are hosting Financial Peace University beginning in February.

I can tell you that Kitty and I took the class a few years ago, back when we lived in Tennessee. It helped us build a budget system. We learned how to have better conversations about money. We still aren't completely debt free, yet. It did give us a lot of tools to understand and track how we spend our money.

This nine week course meets once a week for about an hour and a half with each session. The classes will be held at Immanuel. The cost is \$58.25 whether you're an individual or married couple.

Who can attend FPU?

The short answer is just about anyone. Parents, this can be a great gift for your graduating seniors. It can also be a helpful tool for adults at any stage of life. We will have 12 open positions for the class. If you have a spouse, you can attend the class together or alternate weeks. The important thing is that you make the commitment to be there all nine weeks.

How does the class work?

Each week, we'll watch a video lesson. Then we'll have group discussion and activities to put the video lessons into practice?

What's the point?

Whether you're just starting out in your adult life, are struggling with debt, or just looking for some tools to help control your finances and not let them control you, the series of lessons, discussion, and workbook activities can change the way you think and act when it comes to money. You don't have to have your finances already figured out to be in an FPU class. There's no judgment, no shame, just a bunch of people trying to figure out money stuff together.

CELEBRATION OF CHURCH WOMEN

From WELCA to Women of Immanuel,

Women of the ELCA (WELCA) has had a long active history at Immanuel. There are notebooks and scrapbooks highlighting this history. There were multiple committees with dozens of members each. Prayers were prayed, scriptures were studied, projects were completed. Funeral luncheons were served. Quilts were made and sent to Lutheran World Relief. Monetary donations were made to help promote wholeness in the church, in society, and the world. Delegates represented Immanuel on district and synod level teams. Synod and national conferences were attended.

As Immanuel's membership has aged and declined, WELCA has also felt the crunch. For about 5 years, we have prayerfully considered the future of Immanuel's WELCA organization. We have tried several organizational changes suggested through the churchwide WELCA. None of those models seemed to fit Immanuel WELCA going forward into the 2020s.

While we lack numbers, we still have dedication. What we found was that prayers are still being prayed. Scriptures are still being studied. Quilts are still being made and sent to Lutheran World Relief. We are still assisting families with funeral luncheons. We are still working on projects, just with smaller committees and fewer projects.

Rather than decrying our inability to maintain the WELCA synodical model, we are focusing on our strengths. We will work more closely with Immanuel's ministries. We are going to operate within the **MI Immanuel** model - Praying, Serving, Giving and Loving - through existing ministries at Immanuel while still promoting wholeness in the church, in society and the world.

Bible Study groups will still meet. Prayers will still be lifted to God. Quilting for World Relief will still happen. Funeral luncheons will still be offered to families. Community activities such as Pioneer Days Salad Luncheon and Christmas Market will happen under the auspices of existing committees. Offerings collected will directly support **MI Immanuel** projects of wholeness in the church, in society and the world.



Our enrollment continues to climb, but we still have openings in each class. New registrations are still being accepted from Preschool through Grade 5.


