

IN JULY, we focus on <u>Habitat for Humanity</u> Marquette

County. Habitat for Humanity is a part of a global, non-profit housing organization operated on Christian principles that seeks to put God's love into action by building homes,

Repairs to existing homes are also part of the mission. Two homes are under construction in Marquette County. Support for the ReStore helps with all activities. We also hope to provide lunches for volunteers. Please watch for future opportunities.

IN AUGUST, we will focus on Scholarships for Liberian (Africa) Children, which is educational in nature. We all take education for granted. We pay our taxes and all of our children receive a high school education with no additional charges to the parents. Parents in Liberia pay for their children's education. Any kind of financial crisis for the family leads to the kids dropping out of school.

Pastor Albert (former Pastor of Mitchell Methodist Church here in Negaunee) has personally identified three children who need help with education expenses:

• Danlette is the daughter of a Christian minister who has passed away and is still in school. Her mom, Promise, is struggling to meet the educational needs of three children.



- Simeon has completed the lower grades but cannot continue because his father was laid off by his mining company. Simeon has dropped out of school because the funds to pay the school authorities are not available.
- Obey is an extended family member of pastor Albert. His dad passed away six years ago leaving an uneducated mom with five children. He is continuing his education beyond high school.

Any help with education expenses will be

helpful. We have all heard the expression, "A mind is a terrible thing to waste". COUNCIL CORNER Highlights

Pulpit supply and emergency coverage is set now through the end of July. The list of pastoral coverage is available at the church office.

Information regarding improved barrier free access was received from the Property Committee. Due to physical size restriction of space, the recommendation is to have the elevator removed. Work to the existing elevator shaft will take place and a new wheelchair lift will be installed using that space. This lift will provide even greater access to all levels of the church. The doors for the lift will have an electronic opener / closer and the doors will have windows in them.

Immanuel will continue to prepare a float for this year's Pioneer Day parade. It is felt that this is a positive opportunity to connect and be connected to our community. The salad luncheon for the Pioneer week will be on Wednesday 7/5/23 at Immanuel.

A one-year contract will be signed with Guardian Pest control for insects and vermin.

An update was received on our AED (automated external defibrillator) that is being purchased through the Superior Health Foundation. It is currently on back order. Once received, training will be provided to those persons that are interested.

Council approved the purchase and installing of an electronic door lock system. The system is hoped to be installed by the end of September 2023.

Our church website is in the process of being revamped, to make it be more user friendly and updated with events happening at Immanuel.

Various committee reports were received. There will not be a July Council meeting. The next council meeting will be Tuesday 8/15/23.

AED FUNDED

Thanks to a grant from the Superior Health Foundation, Immanuel will soon have in our building an AED, or automated external defibrillator. An AED is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. AEDs are easy-to-use medical devices that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

"Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me.: ~John 15:4



Dear Northern Great Lakes Synod,

In early December of 2017, I was out in our front yard wrapping Christmas lights around a limb of a tree. The limb was about 10 feet off the ground, and I was standing on a ladder, perhaps the third step down, in order to stretch the lights

over and under the branch that extended horizontally. Finished with that particular section, I took one step down, but instead of the ladder remaining firmly stationary, it moved toward me. If I did nothing, I would fall to the ground from a painful height on my back. So I grabbed the limb of the tree and pulled toward it, thinking that this would stabilize the ladder and bring us both back upright.

No such luck. Instead of righting itself, the ladder fell away beneath me leaving me to cling briefly to the limb before falling to the ground. In my mind, in that slow motion moment, I felt like I could actually choose where I fell, like a kind of gymnastic dismount from the parallel bars. But in reality, I dropped like a bag of potatoes. And somewhere in the confusion of lights, ladder, and branch, the two fingers of my right hand were caught and pulled out, down, and around with a distinctive crunching sound that made me think of someone snacking on a mouthful of potato chips.

I had broken the bone in my hand that was connected to the ring finger and disrupted the surrounding bones and soft tissue. After several weeks in a splint and then cast, I was given my hand back, only to realize that in that brief time, my brain had decided that my hand no longer belonged to my body. It was still attached of course, but not in a way that gave it life and function. The physical therapist called it Chronic Reactive Pain Disorder. In short, my hand could no longer work as a hand should. I could not write or type, play piano or grab hold of things. It was a swollen useless thing. My brain, and my hand, needed to be retrained and reconnected to meaningful communication with the body, so that the brain would tell the body to send healing and reconnect the signals to the muscles of my hand.

So, what about meaningful connection in the body...the BODY...of Christ? What needs to be retrained? What needs to reawakened for life and increased function as we are Church together?

My hand was brought back to life as I watched the 2018 Winter Olympics. While watching gymnasts who actually knew how to land a dismount, I put my hand in hot water for two minutes and then in ice water for 30 seconds – back and forth, night after night. Then exercises, and physical therapy, and more tricks on the brain to get my hand to function in a way that was useful to the body.

Jesus, thankfully, does not suggest that we all dunk ourselves in tubs of hot and cold water to be reconnected as a body. Rather, Jesus talks about connectedness as abiding in him in order to bear fruit. And the way that we abide is by being in relationship with him. And that relationship is conveyed to us in at least two ways: through study of scripture and through relationship with each other as the body of Christ. Again...BODY.

When the Synod Council met in retreat June 9 -10, we agreed to initiate an effort for us to abide, as a whole Synod, as 79 congregations spanning hundreds of miles and in a variety of communities and contexts, by dwelling on the same passages of scripture over a 12-month period.

We will abide with Jesus by dwelling in the Word. Each congregation will receive 12 different passages of scripture, one for each month. And at each council meeting and quilter group, at each Sunday School and youth group meeting, at each and every gathering that month, people from across the synod will dwell with the same text. No preparation is needed. No theological degree is required. Very simply:

- 1. Invite one person to read the text aloud.
- 2. Consider silently the following:
 - a. What do you notice?
 - b. What questions do you have?
 - c. Where might the Holy Spirit be leading us?
- 3. Then have another person read the text aloud again.
- 4. Share your thoughts about the questions with each other.
- 5. Close with prayer.

That's it.

We shall abide. And in abiding, in dwelling with the presence of Christ in the word, and considering the work of the Spirit with each other, we will connect with the one who makes us one, who gathers us as a BODY to embody the love of Christ in the world and for the world.

n addition, all are invited to join the Synod Council as we dwell in the word, via Zoom, the first Thursday of the month, starting Thursday September 7 at 7:30 pm ET / 6:30 pm CT. The Zoom link will be available on our website and in E-Notes and you can add it to your online calendars.

The impact of being disconnected, of having the body forget who it is connected to and why, cannot be overestimated. We need each other to be the body of Christ, and we need the Holy Spirit of Christ to clarify our mission and purpose as that Body. By dwelling in the word together, we shall abide...in Christ, in the Word, in the presence of Christ in each other.



FALL FOLIAGE

"They are like trees planted by streams of water . . . and their leaves do not wither." (Psalm 1: 3) Remember, autumn is a beautiful time of year for those living in northern regions. A highlight of the season is the beauty of tree leaves turning vibrant colors. The wonder of fall can speak only of the promise of winter—a long North Dakota winter, or a UP winter. Now, the understanding of the beauty of this season has grown. It's been said that the trees teach us, at this time of year, just how beautiful letting go can be. Flashes of crimson & gold are the maple tree's swan song before the dormancy of winter. As people of God's promise, the seasons of life come and go. With each passing fall we grow older. 

Why Do Americans Celebrate the Fourth of July with Fireworks?

Independence Day, also called **Fourth of July** or **July 4th**, in the United States, the annual celebration of nationhood. It commemorates the passage of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776. The Congress had voted in favour of independence from Great Britain on July 2 but did not actually complete the process of revising the Declaration of Independence, originally drafted by Thomas Jefferson in consultation with fellow committee members John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Roger Sherman, and William Livingston, until two days later. The celebration was initially modeled on that of the king's birthday, which had been marked annually by bell ringing, bonfires, solemn processions, and oratory. Such festivals had long played a significant role in the Anglo-American political tradition. Especially in the 17th and 18th centuries, when dynastic and religious controversies racked the British Empire (and much of the rest of Europe), the choice of which anniversaries of historic events were celebrated and which were lamented had clear political meanings. The ritual of toasting the king and other patriotheroes—or of criticizing them—became an informal kind of political speech, further formalized in mid-18th century when the toasts given at taverns and banquets began to be reprinted in newspapers.
