Easter Greetings Siblings in Christ!

I hope and pray you had a meaningful Holy Week and Easter. It was an early one this year, so now we have lots of spring and summer ahead of us! It was my first Holy Week and Easter as your pastor here at Immanuel and my first one back in the parish as a full-time pastor since 2018. I described it to one of my retired clergy friends as a "Holy Marathon." That it surely was, she agreed, and then added, "One that I wouldn't have traded for anything." I agreed.

Our walks with Christ are hardly a sprint. If we ran as hard as we could day in and day out, we would know what the final result would be. For me it would be fatigue, burn-out, despair.... We are running Holy Marathons in our lives of faith. We run with the whole company of saints, living and dead, and we run with Christ who lives and breathes in and thru each of us.

This Holy Week you provided a ministry for myself and my family by sharing a meal each day of Holy week from Tuesday thru Saturday. Much like those watering holes and power snack breaks that you find along the course of a race, we picked up meals each day from you to nourish our family in the busy week.

At the start of the week, the meals felt like pure luxury. "Wow, I could get used to this I told my Mom who was visiting!" As the week progressed and as the demands of the week, physically, spiritually, and emotionally, continued and even increased, the meals that you shared with us truly became a necessity.

How many casseroles and meals provided by your siblings in Christ have nourished you along the way? There have been too many to count for me and this past week added to the ways that our family has been loved and nourished by the Body of Christ. Thank you, people of Immanuel, for embodying so well the love of Christ. I see only a glimpse of the ways that you do that. I know the love of Christ that you share in the world is having a big impact. Thank you for sharing your love and thank you for receiving that love when it is your time to receive, like it was for our family last week.

We walk together. We (metaphorically, at least for me!) run Holy Marathons together with Christ and I am so grateful for the privi-

lege to run with you. Thank you.

Blessed Easter. Blessed Spring and beginning of Summer.


Council Highlights

At the April Congregational Council Meeting, a brief update on the changes for the church website was received. The final changes in format are expected by next month, when council expects to see a presentation about the website at that time. Discussion was held regarding the upcoming Vacation Bible School. (VBS) It was noted that Immanuel lacks any good signs to get the word out about VBS to the community. Council voted and authorized the purchase of banner signs for VBS. A Council Representative will talk with Signs Now, regarding the signs and what the options are to have the ability to have changeable dates for different years. Faith Formation is expected to get back with council with estimated costs for a proposed sanctuary family area. An ad hoc committee is working on a child protection policy, which will provide guidelines on keeping our children safe, and be in line will the NGL Synod recommendations. Various committee reports were received. It was noted that it is

amazing as to the depth of activities that go on at Immanuel.

Our Sunday School year is drawing to a close. We had a shortened schedule because of Spring Vacation. These are the Bible stories the children heard and the lessons they learned:

March 17 Many of you may remember:

"Zacchaeus was a wee little man, a wee little man was he."

But do you remember that being with Jesus changed Zacchaeus' heart? Zacchaeus had been a corrupt tax collector focused only on \$\$- until he spent time with Jesus. The Bible does not tell us what was said between the two. But it does tell us that afterward Zacchaeus was a changed generous man. Being with Jesus filled his heart with love, and he was now able to focus on love- not \$\$\$.

April 7 We focused on the excitement of Palm Sunday. The people were praising Jesus, welcoming him as a King. We were going to have our parades with real palm branches saved from Palm Sunday- but they molded in the bag. So we made paper palms to praise Jesus.

April 14 We celebrated the **BEST** day! Jesus arose from the grave. We did acknowledge that Jesus had died on the cross, but did not go into great detail. For younger children it is enough to know that Jesus died-BUT NOW HE IS ALIVE!

April 21 We learned that Jesus gave his disciples- and us- a new



commandment: Love others as I have loved you. and a new job:

Go into all the world and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Jesus then went to heaven until it is time to come back to us.

April 28 Jesus changes the life of Saul. Saul worked very hard to put people who loved Jesus in prison. Jesus comes to Saul and changes his heart. Because he is a new man, he has a new name: Paul. Paul's job is to teach people to love Jesus.

Looking ahead, our last day of Sunday School for this year is May 19.

The recycling bin has been consistently used for paper, plastics and metals! Keep up the good work Immanuel!



SOCIAL MINISTRY/PARISH LIFE



We are especially in need of energetic playful Playground helpers. The VBS kids will be outside in 2 groups before or after Snack Time. Volunteers are encouraged to snack with the kids. The younger children will be outside for about 15 minutes. The older children will be outside for 15-20 minutes.

Our theme is Operation Restoration- Mending Gods World. Each day has a theme. We are mending God's world when we:

Help people who are sick and hurt.

Help feed hungry people

Pray for those who need help.

Forgive and ask for forgiveness.

Rest to spend time with God, others and creation.

Schedule:

Children will be signed in and go to their classrooms for the first morning session.

There will be a midmorning music time, snack and recess.

Then there is a second morning session.

The day will close with a short sing along in the Fellowship Hall. Children will be dismissed to parents from there.

Friday's closing will be a little different. Families are encouraged to join us at 11:30. The closing session will be a little longer and include Sabbath Sundaes and fond farewells.



CONGREGATIONAL DAY VISIT

Day visits to Fortune Lake are intergenerational experiences where people of all ages from our congregation and community go to

Fortune Lake for one day.

PURPOSE: The purpose of the day visit is to provide the congregation with a quality Christian experience for people of all ages in the community.

GROUP SIZE: A minimum of 12 people is recommended for a day visit and up to 40 people can be accommodated. Children under the age of 5 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian who is prepared to participate in the program along with the child.

SCHEDULING: The dates available for 2024 are: June 18, 19, 20, 25, 26, and 27 and July 2, 15, 16, and 17. The visits start around 10:00 am CT and will conclude by 3:00 pm CT. If you would like to participate in an all-camp chapel worship, arrive by 9:00 am CT.

DAILY SCHEDULE: Participants can expect to participate in the following activities, which will be scheduled and facilitated by the camp staff: interactive Bible study, beach time, group games, and arts and crafts. A picnic lunch will be provided. Groups may choose to bring money for a trip to the canteen for snacks and souvenirs.

PRICING: The cost is \$30/person when occurring as a stand alone experience. There is a deposit of \$150 to hold the date. The cost is \$15/person when occurring as part of a Congregational Day Camp experience. In this case, there will be no additional deposit required. These costs include all programming, supplies and meals.


