With our new teachers- Miss Rory and Miss Macie- we are able to plan lessons more specific for the student's reading level. Last year we had fun with our group that spanned Junior Kindergarten through Fifth grade- but we didn't spend much time with our Bibles.

This year, the Kindergarten- Grade 1 hear their stories being read from the Beginner's Bible. Grades 2 and 3 read their Beginner's Bible stories themselves. Grades 4 and 5 are learning to use the adult Bible for their lessons. We are using the <u>Contemporary English Version.</u>

At 10:15 we join our families in the Sanctuary to participate in Holy Communion and the Children's Sermon.

Lessons taught:

- 1. <u>Introduction to Holy Communion</u>- We learned that Jesus meets in and among the Word and Bread and Wine.
- <u>My Baptism</u>- God adopts us into his family. He gives us the gifts of love and forgiveness. There is nothing we can do to earn these gifts.
- 3. <u>Creation</u> God spoke- and the world was created. God saw that it was good.
- 4. <u>Created In God's Image</u> God created humans and saw that it was very good. Our outsides are all different, but our hearts are all the same, created in God's Image of love.
- 5. <u>Prayer</u> Jesus teaches all of us to pray as a way of building our relationship with him.
- 6. <u>Father Abraham</u> Family is very important. We are God's family and he takes care of us. Abraham believed God's promise that Abraham would be the father of a great nation.
- 7. <u>Brother Joseph</u> God had a plan for Joseph. God has a plan for Joseph and us- in good times and in bad times.
- 8. Even his brothers' sins could not change that.
- <u>Baby Moses</u> Egypt had become a dangerous place for the Israelites. God used unexpected people to keep baby Moses safe.


ELCA GOOD GIFTS ADVENT TREE

Safe Congregation Policies

The Faith Formation team hosted this program for Central UP Northern Great Lakes Synod congregations. Darkness into Light is awareness level training to provide



participants with information about child sexual abuse and the need for congregational policies to protect our families.

We obtained a Thrivent Grant to provide a Soup and Salad supper for participants. The remainder of the grant was used to subsidize other costs associated with the training.

There were 13 participants - 5 from Immanuel.

The Synod is working to develop a model policy for congregations to use as they develop their own policies on keeping our spaces safe for children.

IN NOVEMBER, our mission emphasis is <u>Fortune Lake</u> <u>Lutheran Camp Operations and Maintenance .</u>

Can you imagine what it's like to have 400 darling campers in your home just during the summer? Think of the cleaning, repairs and folks who are involved in the summer and all of the special programs during the year!



Running a camp is not cheap. FLLC works really hard to keep costs down but there are always constant repairs, maintenance and replacements. The utility bill alone is about \$35,000, repairs \$40,000, and the personnel costs to keep it running a huge part of the budget.

The November Monthly Mission is earmarked for operations and maintenance. We all love and enjoy the camp. Let's do our best to keep it looking beautiful and keep it operational!

IN DECEMBER, our mission emphasis is <u>Room at the Inn</u>, our area emergency night shelter for adults.

Room at the Inn opened Marquette's first ever permanent homeless shelter on December 24, 2020 above the Room at the inn Warming Center. Local churches had operated a

rotating shelter between churches for nearly 14 years. The improved shelter is a 30-bed emergency shelter with 24/7 shelter access. Over 1600 meals are served per month.



The Warming Center continues to

provide a warm and friendly location for shelter guests to gather, socialize, eat and - of course- to warm up during cold days.



Room at the Inn provides food, shelter and assistance for individuals transitioning out of homelessness. Room at the Inn serves primarily Marquette area residents.

Donations of money and food for meals is much appreciated. Food donations are under stricter regulation so best to check directly with Room at the Inn or check the Beacon for suggestions. Volunteers are always welcome!

Sept. 2023 Council Meeting Highlights

- Finalized plans for Pastor Bre's Installation on Sunday, September 24 at 3:00 pm.
- Confirmed the Elevator/Chairlift project is proceeding on schedule.
- Received recommendation from Worship and Music Committee for Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve services. Both holidays fall on a Sunday this year. Christmas Eve services will be at 9:30 am, 4:00 pm, and 6:00 pm. There will be no Monday night services. New Year's Eve service will be at 9:30 am with no Monday night service on January 1.
- Voted to discontinue the lockup position after the retirement of Virginia Paulson. An electronic locking system has been installed. An ad hoc committee was created to establish locking schedules and identify card holders. Plans were made to recognize Virginia's years of service on Tuesday, September 26th after bible study.
- Learned the annual Stewardship Drive will be held Oct.22 Nov. 12.
- Moved the meeting dates for October and November's Council Meeting back a week due to scheduling conflicts.
- Accepted with regret but gratitude a letter announcing her retirement from Alice Mutkala. Alice's last day on the job will be November 2nd.

- Established a starting rate of pay for newly posted Church Office Secretary position.
- Appointed Budget Committee Members: Tom Skrenes, Jim Derocher, Pastor Bre, Mary Schlicht, Tobias Smith, and Noreen Collins. Committee Chairpersons should submit their 2024 budget requests to Noreen by November 30th.

THE UNREST HAPPENING TODAY

(This is a letter from Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton.)

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?" — Psalm 22:1

Dear church.

As Lutherans, we are accustomed to holding tension between two truths. Thus the ELCA denounces the egregious acts of Hamas, acts that have led to unspeakable loss of life and hope. At the same time the ELCA

wars and rumours of war

denounces the indiscriminate retaliation of Israel against the Palestinian people, both Christian and Muslim.

For the past week we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel and Hamas. We also watch a growing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel blocks food, water, fuel and medical supplies and as airstrikes continue to cause unbearable civilian casualties ahead of a justannounced ground assault. We see Israelis and families around the world in the agonizing wait for word about the fate of loved ones killed or taken hostage by Hamas. We are in anguish, grieving and praying for all people who are living in trauma, fear and uncertainty.

Among us are Palestinian Lutherans who are fearful for their families, their communities and their homeland. In our communities we have Jewish and Muslim neighbors, who are also facing the horrors of this crisis and its impact on their loved ones.



Syria: Who controls what? It is difficult to find words that suffice in the complexity of this moment, and in the web of relationships that bind us together, as church, with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our interreligious partners. Yet God has called us to be a people who stand with others amid suffering.

> We must also call a thing a thing. The power exerted against all Palestinian people — through the

occupation, the expansion of settlements and the escalating violence must be called out as a root cause of what we are witnessing. We are committed to our long-standing accompaniment of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

The God who liberates us calls us to be a liberating witness. May it be so. In Christ.

BEFORE GOD WE ARE ALL EQUAL God shows no partiality (Romans: 2:11)

Thus all is made even, and no one has more than another by which to glory before God, who will suffer no person to be despised, censured, or cast out. It is said, "Preach this gospel

to all creatures." In this respect the greatest, wisest, holiest, noblest human being is no better than the meanest, simplest, and most despised one on earth. They are all lumped together, and no one is singled out or separated, for sorrow, or for love, or for praise and privilege. It is written plainly and without exception that those who believe, whoever they are, and no matter to what people, nation or class they belong, and however unequal they may be in the eyes of the world, are in the same situation. But in the life of the world there must be inequality and variety, as there is among the creatures, where each is of its own kind and differs from the others. Yet although all this works in perfect order, no one can say that whoever does this or that will be saved. Therefore in this kingdom of Christ, all is heaped together and comprised in one word in one sentence: not this person or that person doing this or that, but "The one who believes ... Will be saved" (Mark 16:16). There you have it all in one, whether you be Jew or Gentile, master or servant, virgin or husband. "If you believe," says Christ, "you are in my kingdom, saved and redeemed from sin and death." (Sermon on the ascension of Christ, 1544. WA 21:393f) "Save me, O God, from seeking undue human praise and distinction, for I know that we are all equal in your sight. Turn my thoughts outward, toward those around me. Amen." [Martin Luther, 'Day by Day We Magnify You', Daily Readings for the Entire Year, SATURDAY, p. 368.]¹¹
