I want to share a piece of scripture from our first worship together on August 6. Here is a portion of our Gospel from that Sunday that tells the story of the miracle of the feeding of the 5,000:



"Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. ²⁰And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full." Matthew 14:19-20

This huge crowd was far from a gas station, grocery store, or drive thru and it was getting late, folks had walked a

long way, and had to be hungry. The disciples didn't know what to do but to send them away. Jesus knew what to do though. He took charge, blessed and broke the loaves and put them back into



the hands of the disciples who fed the hungry crowd. Everyone ate and was filled with leftovers to boot!

I'll lift up one pearl of wisdom in this story. We don't always have the answers or see a solution to a problem in our lives, but Jesus does. Just as Jesus went to work on their behalf in the story, he is working on our behalf to

help us so that we have plenty of what we need and so that all those around us have plenty too. Life with Jesus is not always easy and we don't always receive what we want, but there is a promise here of blessing what we can offer, including our very selves, and making them far greater than what we could do on our own.

As we walk together, may we remember we need Jesus' help and that what we offer to him is enough. He's the

Arrival time is 9:15. Bible stories, crafts and snacks are planned for each week.


At 10:15 we will join our families in the Sanctuary to participate in Holy Communion and the Children's Sermon.

Sunday School Baptism and Prayer Project



We can never have too many people pray for us!


Here are the ways you can help with this project:

2024 ELCA YOUTH GATHERING

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has announced that the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering will be held in **New Orleans**, July 16-20, 2024. The Gathering pre-events — the Multicultural Youth Lead-

ership Event (MYLE) and the tAble, the ELCA gathering for youth living with disabilities — will be held July 13-16.

The Gathering brings together thousands of high-school age Lutherans from across the country & overseas for faith formation, worship, fellowship and service. The ELCA Young Adult Gathering will take place in New Orleans during the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering (July 16-20, 2024). Programming and content are still being discerned. Young adult participants are invited to join the ELCA Youth Gathering's Mass Gathering and closing worship. The registration fee for the ELCA Young Adult Gathering is \$260 per person, which will increase to \$310 per person on Nov. 2, 2023 and then again to \$360 on Feb. <u>15, 2024</u>.

Immanuel's 8th—12th grades are planning this trip. This will be a life-changing faith formation event. Youth & chaperones will get to explore the city, connect with others, worship & deep dive into the theme of *Created to Be*. The days will be focused on active exploring, serving & playing. The evenings will be spent enjoying phenomenal speakers on subjects close to the hearts of teens & concerts from Christian musicians who are at the top of the Christian music charts.

For those interested, there will be a meeting on Sunday, August 27th, at 6 pm, at Immanuel where details will be explained, including cost. Because of travel, this group will probably be gone July 15-21st.

When CROP began in 1947 (under the wing of Church World Service, which was founded in 1946), CROP was an acronym for the "Christian Rural Overseas Program." Its primary mission was to help Midwest farm families to share their grain with hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia.


The Faith Formation Team in conjunction with the Youth Ministry team will be hosting this training event for the Superior Central area of our Synod.

The Church Council met on Tuesday, August 15.

We discussed items as listed below:

- Pastor Bre's installation will be held on Sunday, September 24 at 3:00 p.m. Ben has generously volunteered to cook, and Linda Derocher will help to coordinate side dishes and desserts. Please let Linda know if you are willing to help.
- The elevator will be out of commission for 3-4 weeks as preparations begin to install the wheelchair lift. Thanks to Marty Saari for his oversight of this project.
- Immanuel's float in the Pioneer Parade was warmly received as were the can koozies that were given away.
- Our website is in the process of being updated.
- The new AED has arrived and will be installed soon. The first training for designated volunteers will be held on Sunday, August 27. Additional trainings will be scheduled.
- Automated locks have been installed on four entrance doors. After years of performing lock up duties, Virginia Paulson has resigned from the position. The Staff Support Committee will be looking for someone to fill this role which will include use of the automated locks. We are grateful to Viriginia for her dedicated service to Immanuel.
- Sunday School will begin on Sunday, September 10. Paulette is looking for volunteers to teach as enrollment numbers have increased. This is a good thing! Please prayerfully consider volunteering to teach/ help at Sunday School. Plans for confirmation are underway that will include a collaboration with area churches.
- Our youth will be participating in several church-wide gatherings in 2024. It is anticipated that the costs will be considerable. While our youth will be participating in fundraising activities funding will also come from church resources. AED FUNDED & ARRIVED

Our AED (automated external defibrillator) has arrived and will soon be installed! An AED is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. AEDs are easy-to-use medical devices that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. AEDs SAVES LIVES!!



We are encouraging people from across the ministries of Immanuel be trained in the use of the AED. This includes both Sunday and Monday worship services, quilters, various Bible Study and committee members, etc.

The first training which includes a certification in CPR will be held on August 27. Additional trainings will be held in September.

WELCA ACTIVITIES Fall 2023: "Holy places," a three-session Bible study by the Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni



Physical places often shape our identities, relationships, and faith. "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it," Paul writes. Part of what this means is that faith doesn't just reside in our

thoughts or emotions. Faith resides in our whole bodies, and how our bodies "live and move and have our being" in the sacred places where God encounters us. In this Fall 2023 Gather Bible study, written by an ELCA missionary living in Jerusalem, we'll explore what holy places mean, not only for the Holy Land of the Bible, but for each of us, wherever we may be.

September 2023

Holy places: Home

Home can be the place we lay our head and the people we call family. Home can be our community or homeland. Home is also found wherever we truly and fully belong. This month, we consider the complexity and the promise of "home" through the stories of Israel's exile, the ministry of Jesus, and the promises of Revelation.

October 2023

Holy places: Sanctuary

For thousands of years, physical spaces have been set apart for individual prayer and community worship. "Sanctuary" is one word for such spaces. Throughout history, "sanctuary" has also referred to spaces of safety and refuge. If God is everywhere, what is the importance of sanctuary? What can Jesus' teachings and Paul's correspondence with the early church teach us about what sanctuary looks like today?

November 2023

Holy places: Pilgrimage

Pilgrimage, a journey to a sacred place, is a spiritual practice with a long history in Christianity (and many other religions). In the Bible, pilgrimage is not only about the destination, but also about the "holy place" of the journey itself. Considering the journey of the Magi, the walk to Emmaus, and Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, we'll ponder how pilgrimage can inspire, challenge, and transform our faith and our lives.



Three service agencies in Marquette that serve the most vulnerable in our

community are Room at the Inn, the Women's Center, and Superior Connections Recovery Community Organization. Each of these organizations are in need of community support. Funding which was Women's available during COVID has been cut leav-ing these agencies in need of supplies and

Center funding. Room at the Inn, an emergency shelter, is able to house thirty homeless with a goal of helping them find more permanent shelter and employment. The Women's Center provides emergency shelter to victims of domestic violence or sexual assault. Superior Connections also provides shelter to the homeless in our community, housing about twenty guests who are unable to find a space at Room at the Inn because it is filled or exhibit behaviors from mental illness which makes it difficult to follow the behavior guidelines at Room at the Inn. These guests were housed in a couple of Marquette churches last winter and are currently housed in a local motel. / Some supplies needed by all three of these organizations are paper products such as paper towels, paper plates, napkins, toilet paper; feminine products, tampons and pads; snack foods; plastic spoons and forks; coffee, creamer, sugar. The Superior Connections Recovery group is also in need of dinner meals. If you are willing to provide a ready to eat meal to these guests, please call Kim Frost 906-458-1382. Donations for these group can be made by depositing items in the tub labeled Room at the Inn by the Fellowship Hall in Immanuel. Donations can be in a bag labeled with one of the above agencies. Items not specified for a specific group will be divided to the agencies as needed. / Given the increasing cost of groceries, it is hard to add items to our given lists. The homeless and vulnerable in our towns are desperately in need of love and support. Thank you for reaching out to those in our community who need our help. 
